“Linux: The Experimenter’s Operating System”

The spirit of Amateur Radio has always been about experimentation. The functionality we take for granted in most modern cell phones has in fact copied what Amateur Radio pioneered decades ago: the ability to transmit messages wirelessly from one person to the next, send and receive pictures, and even track one’s current position via GPS. Most cell phones use these features as an incentive to promote their product, and consumers are happy to pay monthly service fees to enjoy these convenient benefits. Hams wrought this communication ability decades ago, from scratch, via the spirit of experimentation and the noble ideal of sharing their inventions with all their fellow hams.

It is this mindset of sacrifice and giving towards the greater good that has allowed Amateur Radio to prosper for so many decades. And now that we are knee deep in the digital era of communications, it seems only appropriate to give honorable mention to Linux -- as it was grounded on the same principles as Amateur Radio: giving to the community it serves.

For those unfamiliar, Linux is a free Operating System for PCs

that normally require Microsoft Windows. Did he say free? Yes! You can download a free copy of Linux, which comes with an email client, internet browser, and virtually everything else you’ve grown accustomed to with Windows. There’s even an Office application that provides comparable functionality found in Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint, with built-in logic to read your old documents! The list of free applications out there is virtually endless, and Amateur Radio programs are no exception!

Because Linux is “open source”, it’s free to everyone, and the source code for its programs are publicly available to anyone who wants it. There’s no licensing, proprietary code, or hidden service fee for using Linux. It’s out there for anyone and everyone to use, and it’s very flexible. So, it’s no surprise that Linux is the perfect environment for digital communication experimentation!

These days, computers and Amateur Radio pretty much go hand in hand. Even if you're not using APRS or SSTV, a computer is certainly a helpful assistant for logging your contacts, and pinpointing a map location so you can see where your radio waves are landing!

And let's not forget about PSK-31, or the D-STAR system! There are lots of new digital innovations occurring, and if you're the programming type - Linux should be your playground. It's the only environment I'm aware of that still makes it easy to talk directly with the innards of your computer. Did you know that APRS relies on the AX.25 protocol -- which is already built-in to Linux? (For those of you studying for your General / Extra, I'm pretty sure the APRS protocol is in pool of test questions).

Even if you're not interesting in programming, Linux is a great Operating System. It's extremely solid, and it's gaining wide acceptance in Corporate America because the machines can stay up for years without requiring a reboot! Every time you utilize Google's internet search, you're using thousands upon thousands of Linux servers to hunt for the data your searching for -- and when's the last time you saw Google unavailable?

Another positive feature with Linux is that it has excellent driver support. I downloaded a copy of Linux recently and was astounded to find that it detected all of my devices on my laptop. Even after a fresh Windows install, separate driver discs are common for setting up Windows on a new machine.
