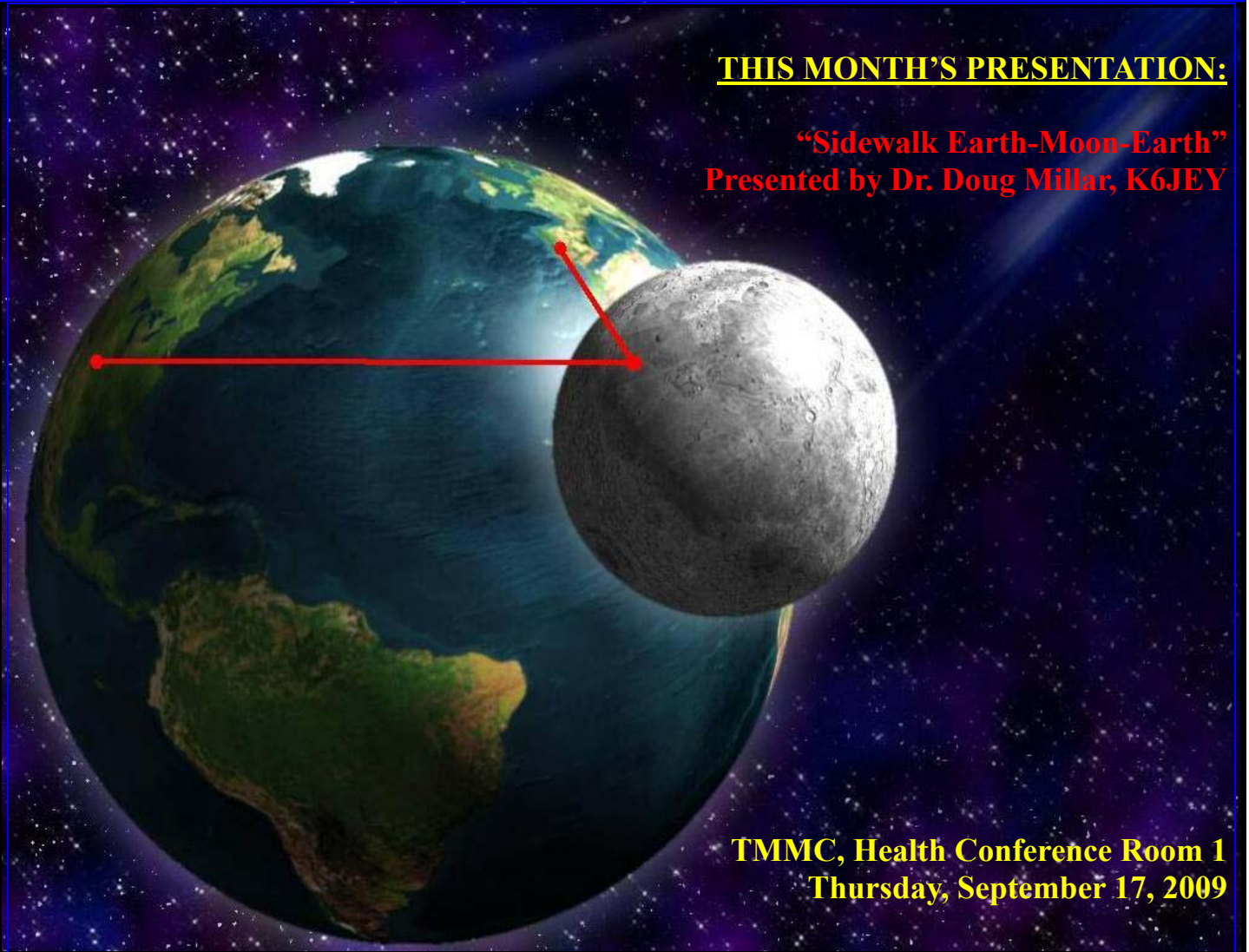

It was a pleasure to work with Alan KG6GPL on the committee. His input was instrumental, and his writing skills made the changes more professional.

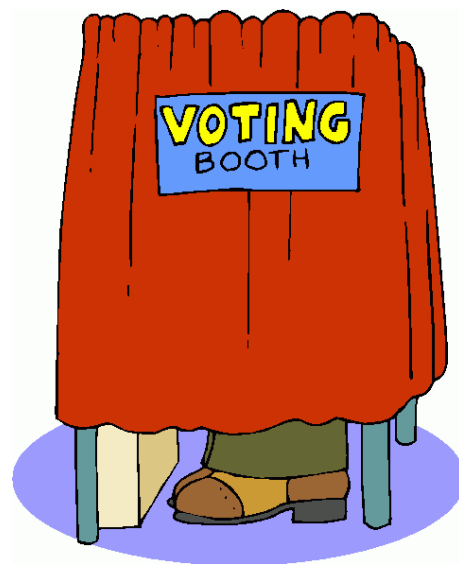
Please review your copy of the Constitution and Bylaws to make an informed decision when we have the vote to accept the revisions at the September 17 meeting.

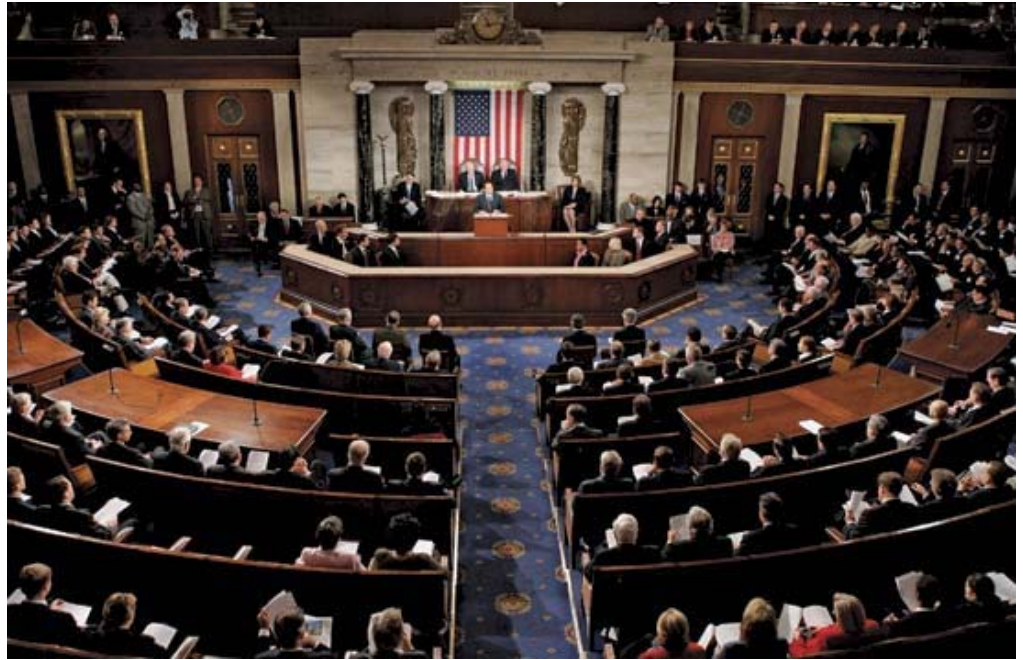

**H.R. 2160:
111th Congress**

Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2009

Purpose:

To promote and encourage the valuable public service, disaster relief, and emergency communications provided on a volunteer basis by licensees of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, by undertaking a



study of the uses of amateur radio for emergency and disaster relief communications, by identifying unnecessary or unreasonable impediments to the deployment of Amateur Radio emergency and disaster relief communications, and by making recommendations for relief of such unreasonable restrictions so as to expand the uses of amateur radio communications in Homeland Security planning and response.

Status:

This bill is in the first step in the legislative process. Introduced bills and resolutions first go to committees that deliberate, investigate, and revise them before they go to general debate. The majority of bills and resolutions never make it out of committee. [Last Updated: Sep 11, 2009 8:29AM]

Summary of what the Bill asks for:

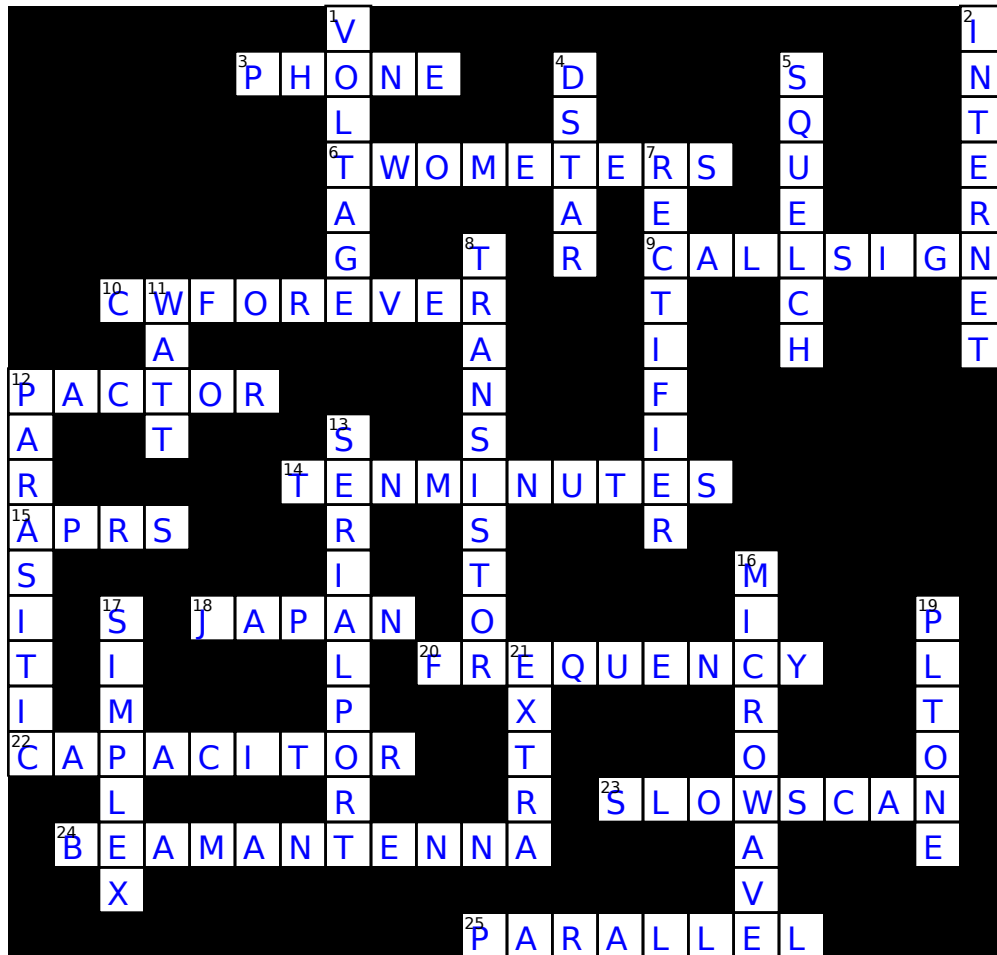
Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2009 - Directs the Secretary of Homeland Security to:

- (1) study the uses and capabilities of amateur radio communications in emergencies and disaster relief;*
- (2) use the expertise of the American Radio Relay League in the study;*
- (3) report to Congress.*

The ARRL is encouraging all HAMS to write to their local representative and offer support for this important Amateur Radio Bill. A sample letter is available at the following web link:

Set your Calendars for the California QSO Party;

Begins: 1600 UTC - 3 October 2009

Ends: 2200 UTC - 4 October 2009

The California QSO Party (CQP) is the premier state QSO party held every year on the first weekend of October. The Northern California Contest Club (NCCC) has sponsored CQP since 1974. Stations outside of California, worldwide, work stations in California only. The 58 counties of CA are the multipliers. California stations work all stations in or out of CA. The 50 US states and 8 Canadian provinces are the multipliers. Stations outside of Canada and the US add to one's QSO total but do not count as multipliers. See the full set of CQP Rules <http://www.cqp.org/>

EXCHANGE: California stations send QSO number and county

Stations outside of California send QSO number and State, Canadian area, or Country

California stations must log the complete exchange, including county even though they all count as "CA" in multiplier.

Multipliers: California Stations count U.S. states (50) and Candian areas (8): QC, ON, MB, SK, AB, BC plus MR (NB, NL, NS, PE) and NT (NT, NU, YT). Log "DX" contacts as DX. Maximum of 58 multipliers. Non-California Stations count California counties for a maximum of 58 multipliers.

SCORE: The total score is the total of QSO points multiplied by the total number of multipliers (58 maximum).

FREQUENCIES: 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2 meters. (WARC band contacts do not count.)

Suggestions:

CW on 1815 and 40 kHz up from the band edge. Try CW on the half hour.

Phone on 1845, 3850, 7230, 14250, 21300, 28450. Try Phone on the hour.

Try 160 at 0500 UTC, 80/75 at 0300 and 0700 UTC.

VHF: Look for 2M FM activity on 147.54 mHz

For 6M and 2M SSB/CW, first try 50.135 and 144.210, if no activity,

make a short call on 50.125/144.200 and then QSY back. Rally at 2000 and 0400 UTC.

Miscellaneous: Only one county per exchange, California stations that change counties are considered to be a new station and may be contacted again for point and multiplier credit. Single-Operator entries limited to 24-hours maximum. Time off must be a minimum of 15-minutes and clearly marked in the log. Multi-Operators entries may operate the full 30-hours. Low Power is all transmitter output less than 200 watts. QRP is all transmitter output less than 5 watts. Stations may be worked only once on CW and once on Phone per band. All CW contacts must be made outside the Phone sub-bands except for 160 meters and VHF. MCW is not permitted. All contacts must be Simplex. Mobile is a station that is self-contained, capable of legal motion (land, water, or air) while operating, motion optional. A County Expedition is an operation from a temporary location using temporary antennas installed for the contest period and using temporary antenna supports. A Novice/Technician entry must use a Novice/Technician call sign and operate exclusively within the Novice/Technician bands. Club members can submit their logs for the club competition. Entries must be postmarked no later than November 15, 2009
